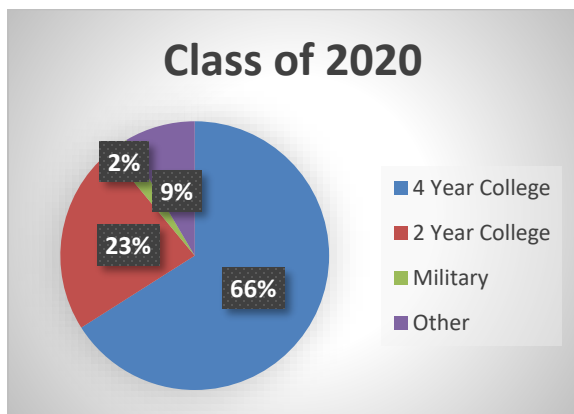

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Through an annual survey of all seniors, the class of 2020 reported these postsecondary plan intentions. Due to COVID closure, not all students reported plans. This data is based on the 452 responses we received from Class of 2020 (615 Graduates). For comparison, Class of 2019 reported 50% 4 year college, 28% 2 year, 14% employed, 3% military, and 5% other.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT: Advanced Placement courses are indicated by the designation (AP) preceding the course title on the transcript. **AP courses are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality point.** WPHS offers the following advanced placement courses for 11th and 12th grade students: Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Comparative Government & Politics, Computer Science A, Government, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, European History, French Language, German Language, Human Geography, Latin, Macro/Microeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics C, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, Studio Art, U.S. History. World History and Human Geography are available to 10th grade students.

DUAL ENROLMENT COURSES: Dual Enrollment classes, designated with a DE (except for Multivariable/Matrix Algebra – DE with George Mason) after their title are semester-long classes approved for high school credit as well as college credit through the Northern Virginia Community College system. **DE courses are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality point.** They are English 12, US/VA History and Entrepreneurship. Other Dual Enrollment options are available through FCPS Academy programs.

HONORS COURSES: Honors classes (except for 4th and 5th year of French, German, Spanish and Latin, STEM Engineering, Stem Advanced Engineering and Emerging Technology and STEM Advanced Electronics & Robotics) are labeled with (HN) on the student's transcript. **Honors course are weighted with an additional 0.5 quality point.** In addition to the courses just named, the honors courses offered are: English 9,10,11,12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus with Trig, Biology, Chemistry, Geosystems, World History and Geography 1 & 2, VA & US History, and VA and US Government.

FCPS is the tenth largest school system in the nation with approximately 188,000 students attending 198 schools and centers. 29% percent of all students are projected to receive services for English learners (EL). 14.5% are projected to receive special education services. 31 percent of all FCPS students are eligible for the Federal Free and Reduced-Price Meals Program (FRM).

Located in Fairfax County, Virginia, FCPS is the most populous jurisdiction in Virginia and the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area, with more than one million residents. West Potomac is located near the Potomac River between Mt. Vernon and the city of Alexandria and opened in 1985 combining two existing schools.

COVID-19 Information

During the Spring 2020, FCPS school buildings were closed from March 13 to the end of the school year, and students were provided with both synchronous and asynchronous distance learning. Students were awarded final grades equivalent to their semester grade or one grade bump higher than their semester grade (B to a B+) based on their level of engagement and mastery of subject matter. FCPS has opened schools virtually for the 2020-21 School Year.

Students receive virtual instruction 5 days per week, including 4 days of live, face-to-face online instruction with teachers and one day of independent, asynchronous learning. Each class is 80 minutes in length. Student attendance is required and all students will receive assignments that will be graded.
