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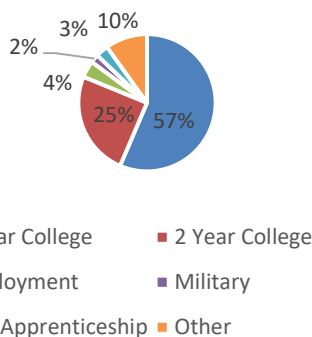

ADVANCED PLACEMENT: Advanced Placement courses are indicated by the designation (AP) preceding the course title on the transcript. **AP courses are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality point.** WPHS offers the following advanced placement courses for 11th and 12th grade students: Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Comparative Government & Politics, Computer Science A, Government, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, European History, French Language, German Language, Human Geography, Latin, Macro/Microeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics C, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, Studio Art, U.S. History. World History and Human Geography are available to 10th grade students.

DUAL ENROLMENT COURSES: Dual Enrollment classes, designated with a DE (except for Multivariable/Matrix Algebra – DE with George Mason) after their title are semester-long classes approved for high school credit as well as college credit through the Northern Virginia Community College system. **DE courses are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality point.** They are English 12, English 11, US/VA Government, US/VA History and Entrepreneurship. Other Dual Enrollment options are available through FCPS Academy and online campus programs.

HONORS COURSES: Honors classes (except for 4th and 5th year of French, German, Spanish and Latin, STEM Engineering, Stem Advanced Engineering and Emerging Technology and STEM Advanced Electronics & Robotics) are labeled with HN on the student's transcript. **Honors course are weighted with an additional 0.5 quality point.** In addition to the courses just named, the honors courses offered are: English 9,10,11,12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus with Trig, Biology, Chemistry, Geosystems, World History and Geography 1 & 2, VA & US History, and VA and US Government.

Six high school academies offer technical and specialized courses not found at all high schools. Career and Technical Education (CTE), fine arts, and world languages courses are accessed by students from all high schools. CTE courses offer numerous credentialing opportunities for students who pass industry certification exams.

Mission Statement – Fairfax County Public School inspires and empowers students to meet high academic standards, lead healthy, ethical lives, and be responsible and innovative global citizens.

Community

FCPS is one of the largest school divisions in the nation with more than 177,500 students attending 199 schools and centers. FCPS students come from countries around the world and speak more than 180 different languages. Nearly half of the students enrolled in an FCPS school speak a language other than English at home. During the 2021-22 school year, approximately 37.0 percent of FCPS students identified themselves as White; 27.4 percent Hispanic; 19.3 percent Asian; 9.8 percent Black, and 6.5 percent identified as multi-racial or other.

Nineteen percent of FCPS students are projected to receive services for English learners (EL). Approximately 15.1 percent are projected to receive special education services. Over 31 percent of all FCPS students are eligible for the Federal Free and Reduced-Price Meals Program (FRM).

Located in Fairfax County, Virginia, FCPS is located in the most populous jurisdiction in Virginia and the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area, with more than one million residents. Over 62 percent of Fairfax County's population has a bachelor's degree.

West Potomac is located near the Potomac River between Mt. Vernon and the city of Alexandria and opened in 1985 combining two existing schools.

Grading Policy Changes Affecting the 2020-21 School Year.

To provide increased flexibility to students and ensure they were not penalized by the challenges of distance learning, FCPS made the following changes to the high school grading policy for the 2020-21 school year only. These changes were announced in March of 2021. They included:

-Use of No Mark (NM) instead of F grades for all courses. No credit was awarded, and the course was not factored into the student's grade point average (GPA).

-Students/families could choose a mark of "P" (pass) instead of passing letter grades as their final mark in up to two current high school courses. Students had the opportunity to choose this through fourth quarter. This flexibility is in addition to the allowances for designating courses as pass/fail at the beginning of the school year. Therefore, a student's transcript may include more marks of "P" than typically seen on an FCPS transcript.

Grading System

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated on the basis of all high school courses for which credit has been earned, attempted, and previously awarded. High School courses taken in middle school may be expunged from the high school transcript. The parent must submit a request within nine weeks of his/her child entering an FCPS high school.
