West Potomac College Application Process



- 1. Submit Transcript Request Form(s) and Consent For Release Of Student Records in Support of Postsecondary Applications (IS-111) to your school counselor <u>one month</u> prior to first deadline. Transcript request forms can be submitted throughout the school year <u>one month</u> prior to a college deadline. *See transcript request form for specific due dates surrounding holiday breaks.
- 2. School Counselor Recommendation letter process Complete senior packet, resume, and activity list and send it to your counselor by 9/22/23.
- 3. Teacher Recommendation letter process Ask teachers to write a letter on your behalf at least one month prior to first college deadline.
- 4. Student sends all test scores to colleges from CollegeBoard and/or ACT (**WP does not send ACT, SAT, or AP scores**).

Other student responsibilities include: completing applications, sending scores, monitoring deadlines, researching scholarships, following up with college admissions reps regarding completion of applications and checking your professionally established email.

We do not release letters to students or parents as the letters considered confidential between West Potomac and the college.

The Counselor Letter of Recommendation Request Form is used to help your counselor write your letter of recommendation. Students and parents, please provide as much detail as possible. For a counselor letter of recommendation, you are required to complete the attached form and email your TYPED responses to your counselor preferably by September 30th, (Please note counselors are unavailable between June 18th and August 13th). This will allow ample time to complete a recommendation letter.

Each transcript package will include:

- . Your official transcript which lists all final grades through the end of your junior year, your cumulative GPA, and senior courses
- · WPHS Secondary School Profile
- WPHS Secondary School Report
- . Mid-year report including semester grades sent in February for all schools requested
- · Final senior grades sent in June to the college you're attending, based on senior survey answers

WPHS does NOT mail standardized test scores (SAT, ACT, TOEFL) to colleges.

You must request them directly through the College Board or ACT website

Transcript Request Form & Consent for Release of Student Records in Support of Post-Secondary Applications

- Step 1: Access the Transcript Request Form and Consent for Release of Student Records in Support of Post Secondary Applications (Form IS-111). Transcript Request Form is available on Student Services Schoology Course ('Class of 2024' folder → 'Student Services Forms' folder → '2024 Senior Information Form'), Student Services Website, or in the Student Services Office.
- Step 2: Fill out the Transcript Request Form completely every column must be filled out.
- **Step 3**: Complete the Consent for Release of Student Records in Support of Postsecondary Applications (Form IS-111).
- **Step 4**: Submit the completed Transcript Request Form AND Consent Form to your school counselor at least **one month** prior to your intended application deadline.

College Application Terminology

Which College Application Platform Should I Use?



It is important to note that one application platform does not give you an advantage with any admissions decision. Common App and Coalition allow you to apply to multiple colleges at once.

- **Common App** Accepted by 900+ institutions. It is "established" and fairly easy to navigate. You must identify your **counselor** so they are able to complete your recommendation.
- Common Black College App (CBCA) For \$20 students can apply to 61 member HBCUs and specify their top four choices.
- Institutional College/university specific application.
- Coalition 150+ institutions that are highlighted as schools that offer affordability.
 This platform also has a "locker" feature to help you stay organized. Your school counselor will submit your information via EDOCS (Naviance).

Early Admission Types

ED – Early Decision: Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early. If you are admitted ED, you must withdraw your other applications. Commitment: BINDING

EA – Early Action: Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date. Commitment: NON-BINDING

REA - Restrictive Early Action: Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm. Commitment: NON-BINDING

Priority Admission: Students submit an application by a specified date to be considered for admission, scholarship money, and honors programs, etc. Please choose this option only if the college does indeed have a priority deadline. Commitment: NON-BINDING

Admission Types



Regular Decision: Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time. Commitment: NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission: Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle. Commitment: NON-BINDING

Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR)



- The SRAR allows you to enter, track, and submit your academic record electronically to participating colleges and universities.
- Students will still need to list SRAR school on their Transcript Request Form.
- Colleges will still require an official final transcript.
- All classes from 9th to 12th grade must be included in the SRAR
- Senior Year grades do not need to be entered; should be entered as "inprogress"
- Examples of some SRAR schools: Virginia Tech, Clemson, Penn State




Naviance Student: Advanced College Search

Tips for a Successful College Application Process



- See your school counselor or college and career specialist if you don't have a postsecondary plan
- Don't be afraid to ask questions- Utilize your resources!
- Set aside a scheduled time each week dedicated to college applications, scholarships, financial aid
- Have someone proofread your prompts/essays
- Remind your recommenders about deadlines
- Don't wait until the last minute!

FAQs

Sample Senior Year Timeline

September:

- Register for SAT/ACT tests
- Meet with your school counselor to discuss your post-graduation plan
- Identify and contact potential recommenders (i.e. teacher, coach, pastor).
- Complete Senior Info Form and submit it to your school counselor (DUE 9/30/22)
- Complete personal statement, essay, and resume for applications
- Research and apply to scholarships
- Narrow down choices to 4-6 schools
 - Reach, Possible, Likely

October:

- Prepare applications for Early Action & Early Decision schools
- College Admissions Representative Visits via College and Career Center
- Research and apply to scholarships
- Tour schools
- Complete the (FAFSA) Free Application for Federal Student Aid

November/December/January:

- Keep your grades up! 7th Semester issued early February
- Pay attention to application & transcript deadlines
- Prepare applications for Regular Decision schools
- Continue researching and applying to scholarships

February-May:

- Continue to do well! Colleges can rescind offers.
- Review your acceptances and award packages.
- Continue to check your email!
- Research and apply to scholarships.
- May 1st Make your final decision, submit deposit, and celebrate your plan and success on "College Signing Day"
- Complete the Senior Survey- Your final transcript is sent to your intended school in June.

Should I change a class during this year?



As seniors transition through their senior year, counselors are often asked:

"Do I really need this to graduate?" Please be aware of the following if you change a class after you have submitted your applications:

- The deadline to drop a course at West Potomac is November 17th.
 If you drop a course after that date, you would receive a WF (withdraw/fail) or a WP (withdraw/pass) that will be permanent on your transcript.
- Courses dropped are not counted in the grade point average except when an F is received for the course.
- If you have already applied to schools, we will request that you contact each of those schools and make them aware of the schedule adjustment.
- We would request that you forward all responses to your counselor to review and discuss how that change would impact the application process.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q1. Does FCPS rank?

- **A.** No, FCPS does not assign class rank.
- Q2. Is my GPA weighted or unweighted?
- **A.** FCPS students have one GPA—once a student participates in an Honors (HN), Dual Enrollment (DE), or Advanced Placement (AP) course, the GPA becomes weighted.
- Q3. I want to find more information about career options. Where do I start?
- **A.** Visit the College and Career Center, take the Career Interest Profiler in Naviance Student, attend Career Spotlights during the fall, and check out Schoology for more information.
- Q4. Do I send my standardized test scores?
- **A.** Yes, students have the responsibility to send scores directly to colleges/universities. Make sure to check if schools are score optional or require scores.
- Q5. Should I change a class during my senior year?
 - A. The deadline to drop a course is typically in November (exact date TBD). If you drop a course after that date, it will be recorded as a "W/P" or "W/F" on your transcript. If you already applied to schools by this drop date, you will be required to notify those schools of any schedule changes.



Frequently Asked Questions (continued)

Q6. Where can I find our School Profile?





A. You will be able to see the date of submission/upload in your Common App account.

Q8. Are volunteer/service hours a requirement for graduation?

A. There are no specific requirements for volunteer/service hours for a diploma. Please note that students who wish to complete volunteer hours toward a civic seal through any clubs, honor society or outside organizations may still do so. Check with sponsors and government teachers for questions and details.

Q9. Does my application need to be submitted at the same time as my transcript and recommendation letters?


A. No. You do not need to coordinate submitting your application at the same time your transcript and recommendation letters are submitted. Please submit your application by the due date.

Q10. Where can I get a copy of my unofficial transcript?

A. Your unofficial transcript is available in <u>StudentVUE and ParentVUE</u>.
