

A Message to Parents

Do any of the following characteristics fit your child?

- Strong capacity to recall historical events with details, but struggles with remembering spelling rules in a foreign language, for example, or multiplication facts.
- Loves reading or mathematics and has an in-depth understanding of concepts when presented in one modality (visual, auditory, or tactile), but struggles with another modality in that same subject.
