## Advanced Academics January 14, 2025

### What is the Advanced Academics Program?

- Provides challenging and creative learning experiences to uncover and develop learners.
- Academic exploration and knowledge beyond the standard course of study.
- Requires time and effort outside of class.
- **★** Open access to all students.

College preparatory (Honors), College-level (AP) courses, Dual Enrollment(DE)



### **HONORS**

- Use to prepare students for AP Courses or where a comparable AP course does not exist
- Provides foundation for AP success
- Have a +0.5 weighted grade overall.

### VS AP

- College-level courses offered in high school. Covers content taught in introductory college courses.
- AP Exam in May or June
- Students are allowed to take up to 6
   AP exams at no cost.
- Have a <u>+1.0 weighted grade</u> overall (upon successful completion of the course and AP exam.)

### What are the benefits of Advanced Classes?

- \* Rigor of high school curriculum is linked to success in college
- ★ Expand a student's ability to *read, write,* and *think critically*; analyze and solve problems; and build 21<sup>st</sup> century skills.
- **★** Advanced Academics courses can bolster a HS transcript and improve college acceptance.
- **★** Many colleges grant credit for courses in which students earn a qualifying score on AP examinations.



## Requisites for for Success in Honors and AP Classes

- **★** Effort and preparation.
- **★** Able to manage time
- ★ Organized
- **★** Fast-paced and more comprehensive in scope and depth.
- **★** More time <u>outside of class studying and completing</u> tasks.
- \* Students must or be willing to:
  - think critically
  - analyze and synthesize facts and data
  - Read and write extensively
  - Work independently and/or collaboratively



### What West Potomac Offers Students To Help Them Succeed?

- ★ Strong Professional Learning Staff and Team Culture: Working collaboratively, teachers can structure common activities, interventions, and instruction based on analysis of assessments.
- ★ <u>Diverse Instructional Approaches:</u> Project-based learning (PBL), Blended learning, Hands-on and other strategies that encourages student collaboration
- ★ <u>Silver Day Rotation</u>: Remediation/intervention period on every Silver day during which student can visit teachers.



### What West Potomac Offers Students To Help Them Succeed?

- ★ <u>Mastery Learning Policies:</u> Opportunities to relearn and show mastery of material already covered.
- ★ WICOR Strategies: WICOR strategies stem from AVID philosophy and are becoming a mainstay of West Potomac instructional culture
- ★ <u>Peer Tutoring:</u> NHS student tutoring program provide after school tutoring support

- Which one? Impact on FCPS transcript vs. college application process
- All students start out on the Advanced Diploma track. We do not change diploma types without consulting with the student/family.

## **Graduation Requirements (cont.)**

### ALL diplomas also require:

- 5 verified credits (SOLs)
- AP/IB/HN course <u>OR CTE</u> credential
- First Aid/CPR/AED
  - Typically through HPE 9
- Virtual course
  - Economics and Personal Finance satisfies this requirement
- What about service learning?
  - It is NOT a separate graduation requirement
  - Students CAN pursue special recognition (cord, civics seal, etc.)

- English 10 / English 10 HN
- English 10 HN Humanities
- AP Seminar: English 10

### 10th Grade Social Studies Requirement

- World 2 / World 2 HN
- World 2 HN Humanities
- AP World History


- What is it?

   SY are FINAL, so take time to make these important decisions!


### **Online Course Selection**

- Course selection in StudentVue for 2025-26 is now live and can be accessed under "Course Request."
- Directions posted on WPHS Academic Advising website
- Course selection cannot be done through the app it must be via a computer web browser.
- After student meeting with counselor course selections will be "locked." Any changes would need to go through HS alpha counselor.
- Parents/Guardians can see course selections in ParentVue.

## **Academy Courses**

- Academy options to consider primary in your junior and senior year:
  - West Potomac Academy
    - Health/Medical Science classes, Criminal Justice, TV Production, Music Production, Dance, Welding and more!
  - Edison Academy
    - Automotive, Cyber classes, Culinary, Cosmetology, HVAC, Electrical, Construction, Vet Science, and more!

Priority deadline is March 7th!





## **Dual Enrollment (DE)**

- Dual Enrollment allows students to earn high school and college credits at the same time. Students earn college credit through NOVA.
- Students must meet GPA requirements to qualify, as well as complete the Dual Enrollment registration process through NOVA by the deadline.
- AP vs. DE

## **Additional Course Options**

- FCPS Online Campus (summer and school year)
  - Open to all grades you may take up to two FCPS online courses during the school year.
  - Any school year courses béyond 7 credits will cost tuition; all summer courses cost tuition
    - Cost: \$680, Reduced: \$340, Free: \$68
- Self-Directed Online Econ & Personal Finance (6120SD)
  - 8th course, fee required, summer options available, counselor approval required
    - Cost: \$130, Reduced: \$65, Free: \$13
    - Pass/Fail only
    - Registration for 25-26: Jan 6-May 23, 2025
