Senior Year		
 □ Review and pay attention to the "Senior Packet" given to all seniors in September Complete your college visits, if necessary □ Remember that scholarship deadlines sometimes come first □ Attend Financial Aid Night at WPHS; file the FAFSA in October □ Register (last chance) for any SAT/ACT/Subject test you still need to take □ Follow up on your teacher recommendations □ Submit your transcript request form to your school counselor □ Keep your grades up – colleges can rescind offers if you slack off senior year □ Work diligently (well before the deadline) on your applications □ Send your official SAT/ACT scores to your colleges □ Submit your college applications well in advance of deadlines □ File the CSS Profile only if required by your colleges □ If you are admitted Early Decision, withdraw your other applications. □ Review your acceptances and award packages in the spring □ Make your final choice and deposit to that college by May 1 □ Complete your Senior Survey in May (where WPHS will send your final transcript) □ Enjoy Prom and Graduation! 	r
